### **Legal Support to Veterans**

Whilst serving members can generally receive legal support through Defence Legal, additional free legal support is available for veterans and their families through the Defence & Veterans Legal Service (DAVLS). DAVLS was originally established to provide support to people lodging submissions for the Royal Commission into Veteran Suicide however that support has now been extended to now include provision of free legal support to serving and ex-serving Australians. That support can include information, general legal advice, preliminary assistance and guided referrals regarding issues such as:

- family law problems (including parenting arrangements and the division of assets)
- veteran entitlements and compensation
- family violence and domestic violence orders
- employment law (including discrimination, harassment, unfair dismissal, and the transition into civilian industries)
- consumer law (including issues relating to insurance, consumer credit and debt)
- wills and estates
- redress for abuse in the Defence Force
- mental health rights
- traffic issues and more.

### **Monaro Billycart Race**



Saturday the 24<sup>th</sup> of February Members of 5CSSB/16CSST left for Cooma to attend the Monaro Billycart race. CFN Hugh POLSON was the driver for 5CSSB with CFN Zac MCCLOY driving for the 16CSST team.

Sunday was race day and with all the preparation done in just 2 weeks to build the carts, expectations were not too high. As more of the entrants arrived our drivers were scoping out the competition and thought they were in with a

chance. Scrutineering started at 9:00, with the race kicking off at 11:00.

57 entrants in different age groups and classes were entered with our two entered in the18+ or open category. Expectations were not very high with our carts thrown together and having minimal testing. With four downhill runs each, the fastest time would win the event. There were prizes for each age group and category as well as the fastest cart.

CFN McCloy was the first to go down the run with a top speed of 24kph on his first run, followed soon after by CFN Polson, who recorded a top speed of 39kph just 3km short of the tracks speed record of 42, which was set on the day.

On CFN McCloy's second run the cart had to be pushed over the line by one of the track marshals, but CFN Polson powered down registering 37kph. CPL Eddie DEWILDE took over from CFN McCloy for the third and fourth runs, but fared no better with his highest speed being 24kph, confirming that the cart built by 16CSST



was one of the slowest on the course, with some of the 5-8yr age group reaching top speeds of 34kph. CFN Polson completed his next two runs and managed to maintain a consistent speed of 39kph on each of the last two runs and managed to secure second place overall.

5CSSB also had our GMM set up as a display vehicle with LCPL David LAMBOURNE being the king of the kids and trying his best to recruit for the defence force. The 300 or so locals really enjoyed having the army come in and join the competition.





# FROM THE DESK OF THE CORPS RSM WO1 JON TYNAN

The year has kicked off strong with the Corps leading the way through innovation and change (some forced, others through great foresight).

As the year progresses the Army will see huge changes IOT align to the <u>Defence Strategic</u> <u>Review</u> (DSR). We as a Corps will need to remain resolute and strong, as some of the changes will see us (the Corps) uprooted and /or in new roles not seen in the Australian Army before (more to follow).

### **CORPS**

Corps Instructions have undergone a review / rewrite and have been sent to the HOC for signature.

WO1 Richard Colefax has surpassed his 40 years of service to Army and been presented his Federation Star. Great career Rick (including time (3 years) as the Corps RSM).

WO1 David Clarke has also surpassed his 40 years of service to Army. His Federation Star will be presented in the near future. Congratulations Dave on a stellar career.

WO1 Ben Munro has continued his fantastic work as the conduit between Matt Stone Racing and the Corps (and widely the Australian Army), with a formal announcement being released MSR announces formal partnership with the Australian Army – Matt Stone Racing.

On behalf of the HOC Cell, great work Ben, the opportunities you have opened up for our Vehicle Technicians to gain invaluable experience in a high profile V8 Supercar race team is beyond fantastic. For those not aware, WO1 Munro has instigated a linkage where up to 2 Vehicle Technicians (local to race locations) will be positioned within MSR for the majority of races throughout the 2024 V8 Supercar season. This will see the Vehicle Technicians attend the workup days (Thursday / Friday) as an induction, followed by the Saturday and Sunday as an integral part of the mechanical team working side by side with the team's race mechanics.

### **Corps Shop**

### **ASEME**

Regional Trade Training (RTT) will be run as a trial for 2024, limited to in-service-transfers to ECN 229 Vehicle Technician in Darwin, Townsville and Brisbane, with successful candidates identified in late 2023. RTT is similar to a civilian apprenticeship with trainees undertaking their 'theoretical' learning at a regional TAFE and developing their trade skills in Defence workshops. RTT has enabled the 9 successful candidates identified for the trial to remain in their existing location to complete their trade training. The trial commenced in Townsville in January with 2 apprentices completing subjects at the Queensland TAFE campus in Townsville and On-the-Job Experience (OJE) with 102 Field Workshops at 3CSSB. A further 2 apprentices will commence their training in Townsville in March. The trial will commence in Darwin in May with 2 apprentices completing TAFE subjects at Charles Darwin University TAFE and OJE with 5RAR workshops. Finally, Brisbane will see 3 apprentices start in July completing TAFE through Queensland TAFE campuses in Brisbane and OJE with 8/9RAR workshops. ASEME is currently in discussion with other units in each location to bring onboard more OJE units for each location. The trial will enable ASEME and their JTTTS contracted partner, WIOT, to further develop this training model into a scalable solution for all trades into the future, providing an attractive option for potential in-service-transfer that contributes positively to retention, whilst also contributing to capability in unit workshops.

CO and myself will be traveling to OJT locations beginning March. We plan to update locations on the impacts we see affecting ASEME and the Corps as the DSR impacts begin to be felt, how trade training will be conducted into the future and an update on Corps matters.

ASEME have commenced training abinitio ECN 235 Material Technicians. No longer will members be required to have a pre-qualification prior to undertaking the role. We currently have 2 members in training, with expectations they will be out in units early 2025.

MakerSpace is fully operational, it is open for anyone to visit and interact with. A fantastic asset that will enhance the training of our young technicians moving into the future.

### **Workforce and Training Group**

W&TG are working with ASEME to determine the pay trigger point for a member undergoing RTT. For example, currently an ECN 229 studying at ASEME will become ECN 229-2 (Pay Grade 3) at the completion of ASEME residential phase, prior to going on OJT. This is the same point that a trade transfer changes to RAEME and is promoted to CFN. The trigger point for RTT may be '2 years and a minimum of XX UoCs completed'; with the exact detail yet to be finalised, agreed to by AHQ and then published in the Employment Specifications (ES) at the Manual of Army Employments RAEME page. You can find your current ES by typing 'MAE' in the DPN search bar then select our Corps badge.
